

Board Report February 2018

Consent Agenda- One open enroll in, Mr. Stimson resignation from Boys basketball

Oral Reports-

Annie- updated the board on the fact that senior presentations could begin next month, that grant applications have been submitted for projector systems in the gym and auditorium.

Kreg- I updated the board on the handbook committee meeting that took place, the fact that we will set up a trust account to receive the Lauvre Trust money, that we have received notification of the amount we will get from the casino this spring (24,000.00). I also gave the board an update on recent legislation that could dramatically affect P-C. There has been a bill passed in the house that would supply funding to those schools who are over the state average in transportation costs. P-C stands to benefit if this bill passes the senate.

Discussion Items-

Summer Projects- The board worked to prioritize summer projects. We will be collecting bids on some of the project ideas before we make a final decision on the direction to go. Some of the items brought up included updating carpet in classrooms, lighting, window replacement, library remodel and installing a security/keyless entry system.

Action Items-

Computer Purchase- The board approved the purchase of laptops for staff. This would put everyone on the same operating system going forward. We will use REAP grant funds to make this purchase.

Cross Country- The board voted in favor of sharing Cross Country with Greene County.

Budget hearing- Denise and I will present next year's budget at the March meeting, the board voted to hold the mandatory public hearing on that budget as part of the April board meeting.

Calendar- The board voted to okay the calendar we presented. It is very similar to the Greene County calendar but does have a couple of differences that will get us out a few days earlier.

Statehouse Report-

There is a lot of legislation stalled out currently as the house and senate need to decide on a de-appropriations bill to balance last year's budget. Once that is done, education legislation should start moving forward. Bills expected to pass:

1. Operational Sharing Extension- this is the bill that provides monetary benefits to schools who share operations.
